Definition:

Leadership and Soft skills are a person's attitudes and behaviors they convey when working with other people in a professional setting. Whereas hard skills are acquired through education and training (i.e., learning a new language or being trained to use computer programs), soft skills are obtained throughout your personal life by interacting/working with the people around you.
